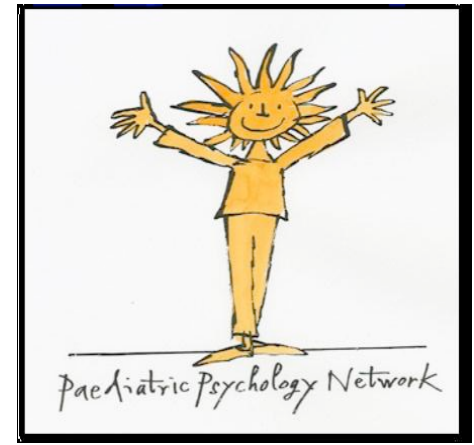
Background

- Formed in 2000 with an initial “study day”
- “To promote the development of paediatric psychology within the UK, including professional practice, clinical governance, research and training” (J. Houghton, PPN Constitution 2006).
- Formally encompassed as a member network within the Faculty for Children, Young People and their Families, Division of Clinical Psychology, British Psychological Society

Current Status

- 250 full members
- “To promote the development of Paediatric Psychology within the UK, including strategic and policy influence, professional practice, clinical governance, research and training”
- 12 person committee
- Key external relationships and representation to ensure the evidence base for PP is recognised and included in guidance, policies etc
